

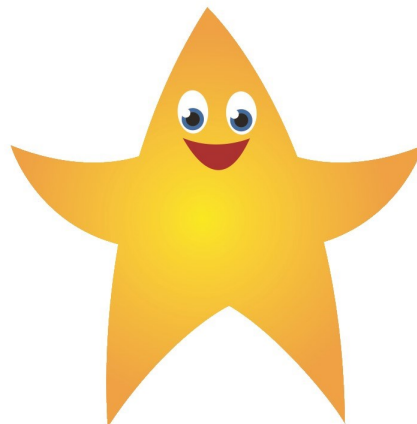
### What is Child Protection all about?

# Safeguarding Policy

### Need to talk?

If you need to talk we will listen.

You can talk to any adult in our school, they are here to help and will listen to all of your concerns.

Try to talk to someone you feel comfortable with.

### Do not keep a secret if someone:

Is bullying you

Is saying funny things to you that you do not like or upsets you

Is touching you in places you know are wrong

Is trying to give you tablets, cigarettes, drugs or alcohol.

Is hitting you or hurting you.

Is sending unkind messages on the internet or to your phone

### What happens Next?

Sometimes a member of staff will need to check things with Mrs Morgan, who is the school's Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL).

If Mrs Morgan can help resolve the issue herself, she will do so.

If Mrs Morgan is not available then Miss Broughton or Mrs L Jones can help.

Sometimes they may need to contact other people who support children and families.

All staff are here to help and keep you safe. If you have a question just ask.
